

Project update

July 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

CPB Contractors (CPB) will deliver the new Sydney Metro Pitt Street Station in the Sydney CBD.

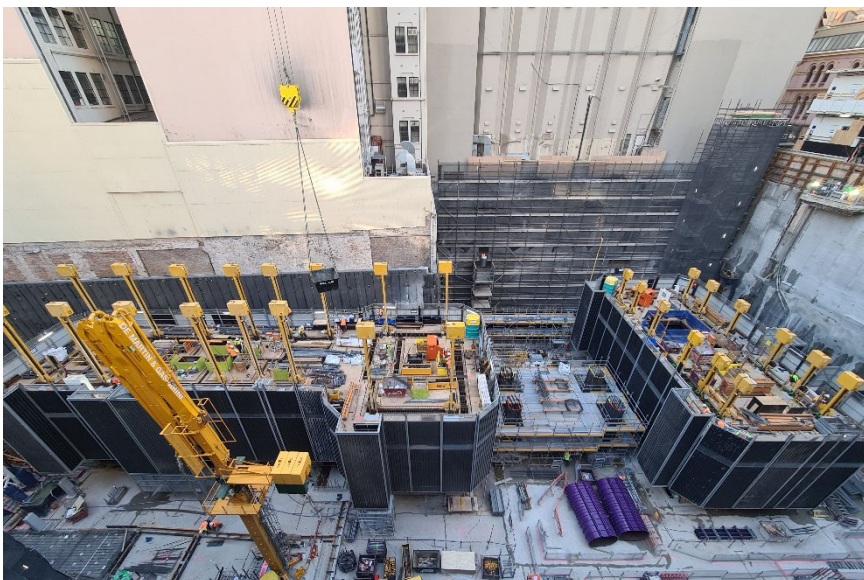
Pitt Street Station construction work

From **Thursday 1 July**, day and night work will continue for construction of the integrated station development.

Below is an indicative table of activities scheduled at the two Pitt Street Station sites in July:

Pitt Street Station North and South sites	<p>Work may include but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daytime excavation work for the removal of existing concrete • steel fixing and formwork to build the core building structure walls • concrete pours for internal basement floor slabs and walls • use of the tower cranes for the delivery and removal of equipment and material in to and out of the sites • waterproofing to seal the external walls of the excavated station shafts • installing formwork for the station platforms within the excavated underground tunnels • welding and hammering for the completion of site hoarding and site shed installation • delivery and installation of graphics and signage on site hoarding and site sheds • scanning, surveying, saw cutting and potholing existing utility services and placing markings on the ground to identify underground services • vehicle movements on roads surrounding the site • temporary road closure and traffic changes • use of work zones on Pitt, Castlereagh and Bathurst streets for material and concrete deliveries • temporary road and lane closures and pedestrian detours on roads surrounding the work areas.

The Pitt Street Station site will continue to implement extended work hours to support the construction industry during COVID-19.

The NSW Government has allowed infrastructure construction sites to work extended hours across weekends and public holidays throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The extended work hours enable the infrastructure construction industry to practice appropriate social distancing with fewer workers on site on any given day by allowing work to be spread across more days in the week. This also allows for jobs to be retained during this difficult time.

These temporary changes will continue to be in place until 31 March 2022 or until advise from the NSW Government changes. For more information, please refer to the Department of Planning, Industry & Environment's website.

Standard construction work hours are **Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm** and **Saturday 8am to 1pm**, the extended work hours allow work to take place on **Saturday and Sunday 7am to 6pm**. During the extended hours there will be no high noise activities such as rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving or similar activities taking place.

Upcoming out-of-hours work

Due to high daytime traffic volumes and the need to ensure pedestrian safety, some work will need to be completed outside standard construction work hours. Community notifications containing further details of work outside of standard construction hours will be delivered to properties ahead of the work along with email updates sent to the subscribed stakeholder distribution list.
